 - Letter of Interpretation (LOI)
 - General Permits (GP) for disturbances to Wetlands and/or Transition Areas
 - Individual Freshwater and State Open Water Permit (FWIP)
 - Transition Area Waiver (TAW)
- An overview of the Land Use Application Procedures including completing forms (LURP2 etc), calculating fees, using the new checklists and the new requirements for freshwater wetland applications will be presented.
- Instructors will also provide participants with an opportunity to address specific questions or concerns they may have regarding the new rules.
